Worried Sick

The ninety-five year old woman at the nursing home received a visit from one of her fellow church members. "How are you feeling?" the visitor asked.

"Oh," said the lady, "I'm just worried sick!"

"What are you worried about, dear?" her friend asked. "You look like you're in good health. They are taking care of you, aren't they?"

"Yes, they are taking very good care of me."

"Are you in any pain?" she asked.

"No, I have never had a pain in my life."

"Well, what are you worried about?" her friend asked again.

The lady leaned back in her rocking chair and slowly explained her major worry. "Every close friend I ever had has already died and gone on to heaven. I'm afraid they're all wondering where I went."

Dear RGAPC members and friends,

Many of you will pick up this edition of the Sonshine Newsletter when you come to worship on the first Sunday of April – which this year happens to be both April Fools' Day and Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week.

Palm Sunday, of course, is the day when Jesus entered Jerusalem riding upon the colt of a donkey, and was hailed by the multitudes as the messiah, the "son of David." Many in the crowd were wild with excitement because they believed Jesus was about to restore Israel to its former status as an independent nation, no longer under the domination of the hated Romans. "Hosanna!" they shouted; "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Less than a week later, the crowds were no longer singing his praises. Instead, they mercilessly clamored, "crucify! crucify!" Scripture tells us clearly that the religious and political leaders conspired to arrest Jesus and put him to death. No doubt the high priest and other "insiders" felt enormous satisfaction when Jesus was nailed to the cross. Soon, they thought, that foolish, trouble-making rabbi would be dead, buried and gone for good!

But at the very moment they *thought* they had triumphed, God was in fact using them to work out his sovereign plan of victory over sin and death. Far from being a helpless prisoner, Jesus willingly gave his life to pay the penalty for our sin. The apostle Paul wrote, "The message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to those who are being saved it is the power of God . . . The foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." (1 Cor 1:18,25)

Essential as the cross was and is, the cross itself is not the foundation of our faith. Jesus Christ – crucified *and risen* – is the foundation of our faith. Jesus told his disciples, "*I am* the way, the truth and the life." Jesus told Martha, when her brother Lazarus died: "*I am* the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will not die, but will live *forever*." Indeed, the whole message of the Bible can be summed up in what Jesus told Nicodemus: "God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten Son that whoever believes in him will not perish but will live *forever*."

"Forever" is a wonderful word, a joyful word, a victorious word. "Forever" is not foolishness - it is God's plan and purpose for all who trust in Jesus Christ. This week as we move from Palm Sunday, through Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and on to Resurrection Sunday, may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you – forever and ever!
