Mapquest and Google will tell you to cross French Creek in Carlton, but that bridge has been closed by PennDOT; and some GPS devices will take you to a destination a mile or so away from our actual house.

This is the best route: From Franklin, take US 322 west about 16 miles. At the intersection of Hwy 173 there is a blinker light. Turn left at the blinker and go south one mile, through Cochranton, until you have crossed the bridge over French Creek. As you cross the bridge, check your odometer. Continue south on 173 exactly three miles then turn left on Black Road. There is a row of tall pine trees on the left as you approach the intersection. After turning left, stay on Black Road approximately two miles. There will be no houses for a long way, just keep going until you come to our place on the right. It's a tan modular home with green shutters set back from the road, with a flagpole in front. Home phone - 425-1916.

#### Pastor's message:

I keep a file folder at home, full of short articles and news clippings that I think I might use some day for sermon illustrations or, well, just because something in the article is encouraging or thought-provoking. Here is one whose author is unknown – or maybe the author just preferred to remain anonymous. I first saw it printed in a church newsletter in Salinas, California, which is sometimes called the Lettuce Capital of the World.

"A church family can be compared to many different things, but I like to think of our congregation as a garden. In order to thrive, a garden – and our church family – needs time, attention and cultivation. It needs the sunshine of laughter, encouragement, affirmation and fun. It also needs some rainy days when we work through difficulties and have serious discussions about issues that matter. And there must be spade work, times of work and prayer in which hard clumps are broken loose and the soil prepared for

turn up with a friend.

Once the garden has been planted, what then? Well, then we tend the garden with care [and prayer], watching patiently for the growth that is sure to come. Before you know it,

this church garden will be a place where every plant bears fruit in season and every soul may find sustenance and strength."
