This year, as part of my own Advent preparations I've been reading some poems and prayers written by Brian Wren, a pastor, musician and theologian. SESSION REPORT (NOVEMBER, 2010):

Approved motions from the regular Session meeting on November 8, 2010:

- Approved the minutes of the October 11th 2010 Session meeting;
- Approved the October Treasurers Report and Financial Secretary's reports;
- Received and accepted minutes from the Trustees (meeting Nov 1, 2010), Christian Education Committee (Oct 25, 2010) and Missions, Outreach and Evangelism (Oct 25, 2010).
- Approved emergency repairs to the bell tower in the amount of \$5,200 and sealing of all cracks in the masonry of the church proper totaling \$1,600.
- After a report from the Personnel Committee about the pastor's annual performance review, and after discussion of the pastor's job description in the Administrative Manual, session voted to extend Rev. Sue Nanette's contract to serve as our temporary supply pastor for an additional year, serving at 80% of full-time.

From the special Session meeting on November 14, 2010:

- Upon the recommendation of the Personnel Committee, Session voted to hire Katrina Lynn Anthony as our church secretary at 20 hours per week, with required background checks to be conducted;
- Approved a request by the Sweet Adelines singing group to use Morehead Hall once a week and to store some of their equipment at the church.
