The Window from which we look:

A young couple moves into a new neighborhood.

The next morning while they are eating breakfast, the young woman sees her neighbor hanging the wash outside. "That laundry is not very clean," she said. "She doesn't know how to wash correctly. Perhaps she needs better laundry soap."

Her husband looked on, but remained silent.

Every time her neighbor would hang her wash to dry, the young woman would make the same comments.

About one month later, the woman was surprised to see a nice clean wash on the line and said to her husband, "Look, she has learned how to wash correctly. I wonder who taught her this."

The husband smiled and said, "I got up early this morning and cleaned our windows."

And so it is with life. What we see when watching others depends on the purity of the window through which we look. From the Pastor's Desk

When I was a school-girl, the month of February held three special holidays: Valentine's Day (February 14), and the birthdays of those great presidents and followers of Christ, George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Valentine's Day was great fun, as classmates exchanged small colorful cards with light-hearted expressions of friendship. Washington's birthday and Lincoln's birthday were mostly memorable because we didn't have to attend school! But when I was in the third grade, my teacher, Miss Bass, made a connection between those three holidays that I have never forgotten.

Now I should explain that Miss Bass was an exceptional teacher. She was creative and energetic and kind, but also clear about her expectations and firm in matters of discipline. Miss Bass truly loved us and wanted us to have the best possible start in life. Every morning after our class recited the Pledge of Allegiance she had us say a short prayer:

"God, please guide us through our day,

and make us good in every way."

Mind you, this was a public elementary school! Of course, America was a different place in the 1950's. Prayer was still permitted in public schools; the Golden Rule and the Ten Commandments were posted on our cafeteria wall.

But even for that time, Miss Bass was somewhat unusual. She used Valentine's Day to teach us - in very simple terms - that all true love comes from God: the love between two friends, the love that husbands and wives have for one another, the love between a parent and a child. She told us that God loves us very much and wants us to know and to love him too.

Later in the month, Miss Bass taught us – again, in very simple terms – that both George Washington and Abraham Lincoln were men who loved God deeply. Because they loved God and trusted God, she said, God enabled them to become great leaders during times of national crisis.

There's a trend amongst modern historians to ignore or even deny the Christian faith of many of our country's great leaders. But the record is plain for those who care to do a bit of research. Consider these words from Washington's farewell speech on September 19, 1796: "It is impossible to govern the world without God and the Bible. Of all the dispositions and habits that lead to political prosperity, our religion and morality are the indispensable supports. Reason and experience both forbid us to expect that our national morality can prevail if religion is excluded."

Lincoln, too, was profoundly influenced by Christianity. During his years as president he regularly attended the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington. He quoted extensively from the Bible, and spent long hours in prayer. On one occasion, a minister from the North said to him, "I hope the Lord is on our side," to which Lincoln responded, "I am not concerned about that ... but it is my constant prayer that I, and this nation as a whole, should be on the Lord's side."

In the 1950's, Americans lived in constant fear of global nuclear war and the "threat" of communism. Miss Bass made sure we knew what to do when the air raid sirens went off. But she also taught us that God is loving and trustworthy, and that men and women of faith can – trusting God – change the world for the good. The religious culture in America has changed greatly over the last fifty years. But as followers of Jesus Christ, we still have the opportunity, and the responsibility, to influence our culture with the grace of Christ, with Godly justice and compassion for others.
