This year the RGAPC summer picnic will be held at the Nageottes' home, as a combination open house & tureen dinner. The main dish, beverages and utensils will be provided. To ensure a variety of food items: if your last name begins with the letter:

A through G, please bring a salad; H through O, please bring a side dish; P through Z, please bring fresh fruit or a dessert.

We will eat at around 6 PM, but you are welcome to come earlier to visit. All RGAPC members and friends are invited. See you there!! Carpooling is encouraged; plan on a half hour drive from RGAPC. Our address is 384 Black Road, Cochranton. We strongly recommend that you follow these directions instead of relying on Mapquest, Google or GPS devices. Technology has limits! Mapquest and Google will tell you to cross French Creek in Carlton, but that bridge has been closed by PennDOT; and some GPS devices will take you to a destination a mile or so away from our actual house. <u>This is the best route</u>: From Franklin, take US 322 west about 16 miles. At the intersection of Hwy 173 there is a blinker light. Turn left at the blinker and go south one mile, through Cochranton, until you have crossed the bridge over French Creek. As you cross the bridge, check your odometer. Continue south on 173 <u>exactly three miles</u> then turn left on Black Road. There is a row of tall pine trees on the left as you approach the intersection. After turning left, stay on Black Road approximately two miles. There will be no houses for a long way, just keep going until you come to our place on the right. It's a tan modular home with green shutters set back from the road, with flagpole in front.
