From the Pastor's Study

Dear RGAPC family and friends,

Looking out into the woods behind our house, there can be no doubt whatsoever that spring has well and truly arrived. Every twig is bursting with new leaves -- the yard an emerald expanse adorned with gold and purple wildflowers -- the early morning air a symphony of bird song. In spring, perhaps more clearly than any other season, God shows us what "new creation" looks like. Notice that every creature is still its own self. Birds do not become fish; an apple tree does not become an oak. Yet in this season, things that have suffered the dreary chill of winter now, by God's providence, emerge glowing with new life.

As the poet Gerard Manley Hopkins put it, "The world is charged with the grandeur of God. It will flame out, like shining from shook foil . . . there lives the dearest freshness deep down things . . . because the Holy Ghost over the bent world broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings."

On Pentecost Sunday (May 27th) we celebrate that time when, as recorded in Acts Chapter 2, the Holy Spirit was sent to fill and dwell within Christ's followers. For this reason we call Pentecost the "birthday of the Church." We sometimes think of the Holy Spirit as primarily our comforter, our encourager, the one who helps us know God and God's ways, the one who gives gifts to the church and who helps us resist temptation.

The Holy Spirit does indeed do these things -- and more. In one of the most ancient confessions of the Christian church, the Nicene Creed names the third person of the Trinity, "The Lord, the giver of life." This "Giver of Life" is precisely the one who does, indeed, dwell in and among Christ's people -- even right here in Rocky Grove. As we continue our journey together, I pray that all of us will become more aware of and more open to the Holy Spirit's leading us, filling us, forming us, and sending us for vibrant new life in the name and the power of Jesus.
