Congregational Meeting

Luncheon and Chili Cook-off

November 20, 2011

As is customary, the "festivities" will include a hearty luncheon with different varieties of soup, and of course, the RGAPC Chili Cook-Off – this being the 5^{th} annual. Be sure to "check in" your chili with Jim Sandok, master of ceremonies and chili-pot-watcher.

Then, you can vote for your favorites by putting money – as much or little as you choose – into small containers placed in front of each crock-pot. The contest winner is determined by the chili which receives the most donations. All the money received goes to a charitable cause, which is decided by the winning chili's chef.

- Payment schedule for the construction work being done on the church: the sum of \$46,800.00 immediately; 50% of the balance of the contracted amount when the contractor certifies that 50% of the work has been completed, and the remaining 50% when the project has been completed.
- The funding of the construction project as follows: The Housing Account with Stifel Nicolaus will be exhausted and the balance will be taken from the Horizon Account with Stifel Nicolaus. [Note for information: the Housing Account contained \$111,321.81 as of September 30, 2011.]

What is the Christmas Joy Offering?

A cherished Presbyterian tradition since the 1930s, the Christmas Joy Offering is one of the four special offerings designated by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Because Advent and Christmas shine a light not only on our world's greatest hope but also on our world's greatest need, the PC(USA) provides this timely opportunity for congregations to support causes specifically designed to bring *Good News of Great Joy* to the poor in circumstance or spirit. Alongside the message of promise and fulfillment in Luke's Gospel, we hear the clear call to God's people to respond in faith as Christ calls us: "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded" (Luke 12:48).

Undesignated gifts to the Christmas Joy Offering will be distributed equally to the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and to support student scholarships at Presbyterian-related racial ethnic schools and colleges.

Special offering envelopes will be in the newsletter as well as the pews for the Christmas Joy Offering. If you are writing a check, please mark "Christmas Joy" on the memo line which designates your offering to the correct fund.
