From the Pastor's Pen - "Gathered 'Round the Table"

Most people nowadays are good at "multi-tasking." We can listen to a ballgame on the radio while mowing the lawn or washing the car. A teenager might easily "skype" with a friend, while working on homework. A parent may fold laundry or pay bills while listening to a child recite the times-tables. My mother loved to talk on the phone while darning socks or ironing clothes. Nowadays I call folks on my cell phone while walking the dog. Some folks are so accustomed to multi-tasking that doing just ONE thing at a time can seem . . well, terribly inefficient and slow and boring.

But just because we are able to do two things (or more!) at the same time, doesn't mean that we always should. Not long ago I realized that at least half the time my husband and I eat an evening meal together, we do so in front of the television. Our attention is focused on a favorite TV program, instead of on what we are eating or who we are with. We ask the Lord's blessing on our food and on our home, but then we turn our eyes upon that glowing box which does absolutely nothing to help us appreciate the meal or our relationship.

Earlier this week, I went to visit my father and step-mother in Ohio. Dad will be 91 in December; Joan is fifteen years younger but has been in poor health for several years. Recently she has become very weak. But despite her health troubles, they eat every meal -- *every meal* -- seated at the dining room table, from real plates (not paper). And even when it is just the two of them, at every meal -- *every meal* -- they hold hands and say grace: "Be present at this table, Lord; be here and everywhere adored. These mercies bless and grant that we may feast in paradise with Thee."

Visiting with them this week was a poignant reminder that the day is coming when Dad and Joan and I will no longer eat a meal together in this life. Our hope is indeed in the Lord and the life eternal he has promised to all who believe in Christ. But seated at that table I also realized the foolishness of rushing through our days, "multi-tasking."

One elder writes "I love a good bargain!"

Session has been receiving questions on what we are going to do about the church's finances; about more money going out than coming in. It has been pointed out that we cannot keep relying on the interest from the savings to make up the differences each month, especially since we will be using monies from the savings for the building repairs, which will decrease interest earned.

Some expenses have been cut in previous years. We have gone from a full time minister to a part time minister, a full time secretary to a part time secretary, and we have no paid youth leader anymore. There are not many more areas to cut.

My question is what are we, as a congregation, going to do about our situation? One answer could be to increase our giving.

When I first started attending church as an adult we would put in \$5.00, \$10.00, sometimes \$20.00 a week in the collection plate thinking that was enough. We were giving "what we could afford". As time went on I started to realize that God has given us 100% of what we have, and all He asks is that we give back 10%. Once I made that realization, we started to tithe at least 10% every week. I did worry that it was going to cramp our lifestyle, but we tithe because that is what God is asking. Since we started to tithe the way we are suppose to, the most amazing thing happened...We did not miss that 10% at all. In fact, we seemed to have more. I am not saying that you should give to get. You should give because you

want to give, because it is what God wants us to do. But, it seems that when you give, you do receive. "God loves a cheerful giver".

I know people say, but times are tough, money is tight. Remember the story in the Bible, (Mark 12:42-44; Luke 21:1-4) where the widow puts her only two coins in the collection plate. Jesus noticed she had given all she had. God is not asking us to give all we have, just 10%. If you are not giving your 10%, please consider it, and pray about it. Jesus will notice. When we give our 10%, we get to keep 90%, and we also get to please our Lord and God. Sounds like a bargain to me, and I love a good bargain, don't you?
