

From the Pastor's study,

Dear RGAPC family and friends,

As this edition of the Sonshine Newsletter is being prepared for publication, my thoughts are on the last Sunday of the month -- the day when Protestant churches traditionally celebrate "Reformation Sunday." "Reformation" can be a scary word. It makes me think of change, and the older I get, the less enthusiastic I am about change. Yet the Christian life is, by very definition, a life of reformation. Jesus was born and died and rose again precisely to bring light and hope to lives that are otherwise lost in darkness and despair. God loves us so much that he accepts us just as we are; he also loves us so much, that he will not leave us in the same condition he found us!!

"Reformation" is a natural and expected part of the Christian's life. This is true not only for individual believers, but in communities of faith as well. While we do well to be cautious about pressing for change, Presbyterians have long believed that it is always appropriate to pray for Spiritled reformation.

In honor of "Reformation Sunday," I offer for your consideration this prayer published 50 years ago and found in RGAPC's red hymnal:

"Lord, call us into the church. Call us in often, and teach us the old words and old songs with new depth. Give us new reasons for coming in and for going out, into our streets and to our homes. As the house of the Lord once moved like a tent through the wilderness, so keep our churches from being rigid. Give us fresh ideas we never had before, and invigorate that which is good but has begun to feel weary. Make our congregation alive and free, so that alleluia and gloria and amen are not only for Sunday, but the experiences we have in our everyday living. O Lord, be praised! In worship and in work, be praised! Gloria! Alleluia! Amen." [by Herbert Brokering, slightly adapted]
