

As many of you are aware, I have been elected to serve as one of four commissioners from the Presbytery of Lake Erie at the 221st PC(USA) General Assembly in Detroit later this month. Thank you in advance for your prayers, not only for myself but for all the other commissioners.

While the bulk of the issues to be addressed at this GA are fairly mundane, other issues are complex and controversial. Else-where in this newsletter, I've provided an overview of some of the more significant items of business. Regardless of what the 221st Assembly decides regarding those issues, some church members (in local congregations, as well as across the denomination) will be pleased with the outcome, while others may be dismayed and grieved.

It has been said so often as to be a cliché, but nonetheless true: we are in a time of enormous cultural and social change. Christian neighbors and friends have honest and deeply-held differences in how they view Scripture, human relationships and "what would Jesus do" in the circumstances we are currently facing. In times like these, when there seems to be no clear path, it is helpful to remember that times may change, but the Truth never does. Jesus is still (and always!) the author and perfecter of our faith, and the head of the church. The Holy Spirit is still (and always!) powerfully at work to guide, direct, convict, equip and encourage God's people to hold fast and proclaim the Good News that in Jesus Christ there is forgiveness of sins and life everlasting. And nothing – *nothing!* – past, present or future can ever separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. With these truths firmly before us, we can worry less about what the denomination may do, and focus on simply *being* the Church that God calls us to be.

Approved Motions from the Session Meeting – May 12th:

- Authorized Trustees to contract the Billingsley construction firm to repair the front steps and to transfer up to \$5,000.00 invested with Edward Jones to Building Repairs and Improvements.
- Authorized Trustees to contract the Billingsley construction firm to repair the steps on the side entrance, which provides access to the sanctuary and Moorhead Hall, with the requirement of keeping the total cost for repairing all the steps to under \$5,000.00.
- The minutes of the regular Session Meeting of 14 Apr 2014.
- The Financial Secretary's report for the period ending 30 Apr 2014 and the following Treasurer's reports: Checking Account Summary, Budget year-to-date figures & April 2014 Financial Report.
- Received the minutes of the Christian Education Ministry Team Meeting on 21 Apr 2014, Congregational Life and Worship Ministry Team meeting on 5 May 2014, Missions and Outreach Ministry Team meeting on 28 Apr 2014, Stewardship and Personnel Ministry Team meeting on 27 Apr 2014, and Trustee's meeting on 5 May 2014, as well as the report on the Presbytery of Lake Erie stated meeting held on 22 Apr 2014, and the 14 Apr 2014 through 12 May 2014 Report on Administrative Activity.
