

From the Pastor's Study

Dear RGAPC family and friends,

God through Holy Scripture has revealed to us that Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever (Hebrews 13:8). He is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End (Revelation 21:6). "End" can also be translated, "fulfillment." Christian Education News

The Christian Education Ministry Team has been working on exciting Sunday School classes for this new school year. New curriculum has been purchased for all classes. There are several classes for our children: Malinda Lukers will teach children ages 3 through 5, Sarah and Jim Speth will teach children ages 6 through 8, Diane Whitman will teach children ages 9 through 11, and Wayne Edmondson will teach children ages 12 through 18. Sheryl Clinefelter will teach the women's class and George Wielandt will be teaching the men's class.

Do you ever wonder where your monetary donation goes when given to the Deacons? Wonder no more! Not only does it pay for funeral luncheons, items for baby baskets that are given out to people in the community, and gifts and cards for the shut-ins; but so much more! The Deacons make quarterly donations to Community Services to help with the needs of those in the community. Sometimes special circumstance requests come through a Deacon and funds are used to buy fuel in winter months or even toiletry items for our fellow brothers and sisters. They also have a Deacon's fund to take care of the essential needs of the members of the church! So now that you know more about where the "loose offering" goes on every 1st & 2nd Sunday, will you be increasing your donation?

REPORT OF SPECIAL SESSION MEETING

On August 24th the Session met with the Stewardship Ministry Team and with Merralee Obenrader, our Financial Adviser with Edward Jones. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss withdrawing funds from the Horizon Account of RGAPC to replenish the Current Fund in the church checking account, which has been falling low and needed to be replenished due to paying the annual insurance premium for the church building and contents. However, at the Session meeting that was held prior to meeting with Merralee, we talked about the per capita that had not been paid to the Presbytery of Lake Erie during the ten years prior to 2014. (During the span of 10 years, only those funds that were received in the Per Capita envelopes were forwarded to Lake Erie Presbytery.) In a thoughtful and extensive discussion, Session members were unanimous that it was only right and proper for the last ten years' of unpaid per capita to be paid to the Presbytery of Lake Erie, regardless of whether the congregation votes to be dismissed from the PCUSA or to stay. If the congregation chooses to leave the PCUSA, we will have to pay the per capita deficit. If the congregation decides to stay, we want to show that we understand and respect our denominational obligations. By **motion**, second and vote, Session approved 1) paying the per capita that was not paid during the past ten years prior to 2014 in the total amount of \$24,341.48, as soon as practical; 2) paying the full per capita amount for 2014; and 3) if the congregation remains with the PCUSA, to fulfill our full per capita obligation in future years. Our lack of payment during those ten years resulted in the other churches in the Presbytery of Lake Erie having to make up our share of the per capita. Therefore, Session members voted to withdraw a total of \$32,000.00 from the Total Return Interest of \$39,948.02 that has been received thus far in 2014. - To instruct Edward Jones, the company in charge of our investments, to take 50% of the interest from the Horizon Account and place it into the current fund until further notice.
- The Financial Secretary's report for the period ending 31 Jul 2014 and the following Treasurer's reports: the checking account summary, the budget year-to-date figures and the Financial Report for Jul 2014.
- Received the minutes of the Christian Education Ministry Team meetings on 28 Jul 2014 and 5 Aug 2014, the Congregational Life and Worship Ministry Team meeting on 4 Aug 2014, the Missions and Outreach Ministry Team meeting on 28 Jul 2014, the Shepherds' Committee meeting on 16 Jul 2014, the Trustees meeting on 4 Aug 2014, and the Administrative Activity report 14 Jul 2014 through 11 Aug 2014.
- The following recommendation: Having thoroughly researched available options, if a sufficient number of members vote to leave the Presbyterian Church (USA), Session recommends that we go to the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians as the best fit for our congregation.

IMPORTANT Information Meetings Scheduled

Session has scheduled two very important "town hall" style meetings to bring the church family up to date on conversations with the Presbytery Resolution Team related to the possibility of RGAPC leaving the PC(USA) to join another reformed denomination. The first town hall meeting will be held immediately after a short worship service on Sunday, September 21st. The second town hall meeting will be at 6:30 PM on Wednesday, Sept 24th. Both meetings are in the sanctuary. People currently listed on RGAPC's "Roll of Active Members" will be mailed a letter (approximately Sept 10th) with further details. While it is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT for all active members to participate in at least one of the two meetings, all RGAPC members, family and friends are welcome to attend.

MISSIONS CORNER:

Missionfest is only a few short days away. The Missions Team has been working on getting things ready for the past few months.

We are now accepting garage sale items, which can be brought to the church during regular office hours. Brad and his crew have been here in the evenings for the past several weeks trying to get everything organized and priced. So, at this point, pre-pricing your items is essential. 
