Dear friends and members of RGAPC,

Years ago, following World War II, a short poem was found carved on a cellar wall in Cologne, Germany. The cellar was a hiding place for Jews during the holocaust. The poem begins, *I believe in the sun even when it is not shining*. *I believe in love even when I do not feel it*. *I believe in God even when He seems to be silent*..."

I cannot begin to imagine the horrors that Jews in Europe went through in those years. Whole communities were annihilated; families torn apart; people treated as less than animals. Yet someone hiding in that cellar – facing an uncertain future and probable death – was moved to carve those words into the wall. Simple words, but a profound testimony of faith that even when things seem very dark, there is light, there is love, there is hope – for God will never leave us.

This is a time in the life of our congregation, when many (even most) in our church family are heavy-hearted and anxious about the future. Of course I am not trying to say that our circumstances are in any way as dire as that faced by the un-named author of the poem. But some among us are facing serious medical, financial or family difficulties. Others are mourning the loss of loved ones. And every single church member I have spoken to in recent days is hurting, in one way or another, following the meeting on January 25th when the second vote for dismissal once again fell short of the 75% approval required by presbytery policy.

Over the next several months a number of our church members will find it necessary – due to their theological convictions – to leave RGAPC to find another church home. We will be saddened by their departure, but we will understand that they have not made this decision lightly. Those who remain will need to make adjustments and step in to fill in the gaps so that essential ministry and mission can continue.

We do not know precisely what the future holds, but my prayer for you and for me is that we will take courage and strength knowing that God walks with us and will guide us.
