At their gate, there is a dollhouse with a little man sitting in it. He watches all day so nobody can escape. Sometimes they sneak out. Then they go cruising in their golf carts.

My Grandma used to bake cookies and stuff, but I guess she forgot how. Nobody there cooks, they just eat out; and, they eat the same thing every night – Early Birds. Some of the people can't get past the man in the dollhouse to go out. So, the ones who do get out bring food back to the wrecked center and call it "pot luck."

My Grandma says Grandpa worked all his life to earn his retardment and says I should work hard so I can be retarded some day too. When I earn my retardment I want to be the man in the dollhouse. Then I will let people out so they can visit their grandchildren.

Meanwhile I spent time with Dianne going through the items that were donated for Solomon's Treasures (antiques and collectibles) and pricing them. We presented the idea to the Session and Missions committee the and rest is history!

"MISSION FESTIVAL" was held for the very first time on September 15, 1984 from 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. We actually took in \$1,312.92 of which \$564.61 went to SERRV and \$24.00 went to Phil and Ruth Stallsmith; leaving a whopping \$724.31 to be used for our mission projects but you would have thought it was a million dollars. The steering committee members were Mary Jane Bausman, Phyllis Richards and Joyce Wetjen. I had forgotten that our report states "Despite the inclement weather and having to hold our Festival inside, the consensus of most people is that our "maiden voyage" was very successful". I guess packing up and moving does have some advantages to it because I found the envelope that had all the information and newspaper article of the first "MISSION FESTIVAL". I will be giving this to Rhonda for the church office file so if you want to look through it, please give her a call in the office.

We have certainly expanded our horizon to include Hot Sausage Sandwiches, Nachos & Cheese as well as Pretzels. We still have our original "Hot Dog Stand" and "Pepsi Stand" (such original names!!). Our wonderful bakers still continue to provide the best homemade pies, cookies, brownies, fudge, etc. for our Bake Sale and we ask that this year is even better, if possible! Our Craft area needs some love and attention too so please talk to Dorie Feather and Marge Sheffer if you have something to contribute. Garage Sale will have a lot of beautiful items for sale as we had a very nice donation from a Rocky Grove family of things that did not sell at their garage sale.
