Collection for ROOT International

During May and June, forty-four (44) flip flops were collected for ROOT International. Rebecca Vogan, President, of the organization gave an informative presentation during worship on June 24, 2018.

ROOT International is based in Mercer, PA, and works to meet the needs of smaller, lesser-known organizations, helping them in areas of benevolence, education, and information (i.e.; networking between entities, providing contact numbers and information to aid their organizations).

In 2002, the work which began in Mercer responded to a need in Juarez, Mexico. Donated material goods from the Mercer area began to be transported there. It wasn't long before connections were made with other local ministries in PA, OH, LA, WV and AZ.

We will be donating our unsold Garage Sale items following Missionfest on August 11, 2018.

A tote has been placed in the Narthex for the collection of school supplies for Grace Learning Center. Please help with this outreach as you are able. We are inviting the students and their parents to join us in worship on August 19, 2018, for each school-aged child to receive a bag of supplies.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

- 1. The birthstone for July is the Ruby.
- 2. The flower for July is the water lily.
- 3. The month of July was named after Julius Caesar.
- 4. John Hancock was the only member of the Continental Congress to formally sign the Declaration of Independence on July 4th, 1776.
- 5. The Fourth of July was not declared a federal holiday until 1938.
- 6. The first White House Fourth of July party was held in 1804.
- 7. Around 150 million hot dogs are consumed on Fourth of July.
- 8. In 1776, when the Declaration of Independence was signed, 2.5 million people lived in the U.S. Now there are 311 million.
- The now American-celebrated song, Yankee Doodle, was originally written by officers of the British army to make fun of backwoods Americans.
- 10. Three United States presidents died on the Fourth of July: John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, and James Monroe.
- 11. July 4th is also celebrated in the Philippines, because in 1946, the country was recognized as an independent nation.
- 12. In one year, \$600 million is spent on fireworks alone in the U.S.
- 13. Most of the signers of the Declaration did not formally sign until August 2, 1776.
- 14. Though it is no treasure map as predicted by Nicholas Cage in "Treasure Hunt 2", the message "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4th July 1776" is written upside down on the back of the Declaration of Independence.
- 15. More than 14,000 firework displays are put on across the country on Fourth of July!
- 16. Bristol, Rhode Island is home to the world's oldest Independence Day celebration. It dates back to 1785!
- 17. In 1781, Massachusetts became the first state to declare Independence Day a holiday.
- 18. Macy's Fourth of July Fireworks Display is the largest in the United States
